Subject Area	Year Two
Reading/Writing	<p>The student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *uses decoding and comprehension strategies to read independently *reads for a variety of purposes *sets, adjusts and meets individual monthly reading goals *participates fully in Battle of the Books *uses the writing process to write on/two paragraphs with supporting details *writes legibly in both cursive and manuscript
Listening/Speaking	<p>The student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *correctly paraphrases information from oral sources *begins to analyze/evaluate speaker's intent *identifies speaker's mood and intent *reports current events and original work *relates inferences or draw conclusions based on an oral report *orally summarizes information *participates fully in the District Speech Festival
General Language Arts	<p>The student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *participates fully in Interior Spelling Bee *memorizes computer keyboard *masters basic keyboarding/typing skills *develops grammatical, language and vocabulary skills as appropriate to grade
Math	<p>Students are enrolled in the appropriate grade level math books. There is always room for enrichment and application of the studied curriculum. All students are required to master all multiplication and division facts in a timely manner.</p>
Science	<p>The student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * will know that oceans have their own unique properties, forces and ecosystems * will understand the basic systems of classification including plants and vertebrates/invertebrates * will review and record observations and results of investigations * will support own statements with facts from a variety of resources * will use observations to create inferences and predictions * will identify tools and processes needed for a project
Social Studies	<p>The student</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *participates fully in local Geography Bee *completes weekly geography/map activities *develops independent research skills on basic history topics *masters units of study from post Revolutionary War through World War II
Music	<p>Music Theory, Mastery of Singing Skills including memorization of classic American literature, composition and composer studies, and appreciation of a variety of musical styles are explored.</p>
Art	<p>Basic study of different art techniques, styles, works, types and artists will be explored.</p>
PE	<p>This level applies skills to game situations involving rules, strategies, and competition dynamics. Students are also encouraged to develop individual athletic skills by setting, adjusting and reaching personal improvement goals. Anticipated units of study this year are bowling and curling, but may also include other sports and activities as well. Students also learn to make knowledgeable personal choices toward becoming healthy, active individuals.</p>
